

How Much Should You Feed Your Cat

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There's a lot to consider — and one excellent solution.

Sleeping 15 hours a day can work up such an appetite. Many pet owners wonder just how much they should be feeding their felines to keep them content. The answer depends on a variety of factors, including your cat's age, current weight, activity level and whether they're pregnant or nursing.

So how much should I be feeding my cat?

The average cat weighs around 8 pounds. According to some animal medical experts, a healthy, active 8-pound adult cat requires about 25 calories per pound per day. So, the average 8-pound cat requires about 200 calories per day.

This means you should follow these guidelines* when serving up <u>SHEBA® PERFECT</u> <u>PORTIONS™</u> meals:

- Feed adult cats three to four servings per 5 pounds of their ideal body weight daily.
- Feed pregnant and nursing cats two to three times their normal amount. (They're eating for a litter, after all.)
- Feed a kitten four to seven servings daily.

When planning your cat's menu, keep these tips in mind:



Feed for your cat's ideal body condition

No two cats are born equal. Some breeds are extra-large, while others are naturally petite. Feed your cat an amount of food that helps them maintain their svelte figure, whether they're a beautifully burly Maine coon or a more slender Siamese. Your vet can help you determine exactly what your cat's ideal weight should be based on their breed and age.

If your cat has been packing on the ounces, scale back the amount of food a touch until they reach their ideal weight.
